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| <p>If you have commercial insurance (i.e not Medicare or Tricare) you are eligible for the Xolair Copay Card. This program helps to bring the cost of your Xolair down to \$5 monthly. The card also helps to pay for your injection cost here in the office, also down to \$5, however, if you see the doctor your normal specialist copay or out of pocket will still apply. We will automatically enroll you in assistance upon enrollment.</p> | <p>If you have commercial insurance (i.e not Medicare or Tricare) you are eligible for the Nucala Copay Card. This program helps to bring the cost of your Nucala down to \$0 monthly. The card also helps to pay for your injection cost here in the office up \$100, however, if you see the doctor your normal specialist copay or out of pocket will still apply. Once your enrollment has been completed you will have to call 844-468-2252 and sign up.</p> | <p>If you have commercial insurance (i.e not Medicare or Tricare) you are eligible for the Fasentra Copay Card. This program helps to bring the cost of your Fasentra down to \$0 monthly. The card also helps to pay for your injection cost here in the office up \$100, however, if you see the doctor your normal specialist copay or out of pocket will still apply. We will automatically enroll you in assistance upon enrollment.</p> | <p>If you have commercial insurance (i.e not Medicare or Tricare) you are eligible for the Dupixent Copay Card. This program helps to bring the cost of your Dupixent down to \$0 monthly. We will automatically enroll you in assistance upon enrollment. Dupixent is a self-administered medication, however, we will need to conduct an injection training appointment and you may be responsible for any services rendered.</p> |

Biologic Therapy Cost Breakdown

Additional information you need to know:

There are some insurance policies that have implemented a “Copay Card Accumulator” clause. This means that when you are using a copay card to pay for your medication with your specialty pharmacy funds, paid by the copay card, this will not help to go toward your deductible or out of pocket limits for your insurance plan. Biologic medications range from roughly \$1,000 - \$6,000 monthly. The alternative recommendation is to pay the copay amount with your specialty pharmacy using cash or credit and ask for a detailed receipt from your specialty pharmacy representative. You will then submit your receipt directly to the copay card program and they will mail you a check to reimburse for the amount you paid. Your payment will be honored as deductible and/or out of pocket payments.
